020 was a difficult year for many clubs. So much so that six clubs ended up dissolving. We also saw an overall decrease in membership to just under 20,000. However, there was some good news even during the tough year.

It wasn't all bad news. Many clubs were able to get in some great volunteer hours and fundraising prior to the pandemic. Others found creative ways to help their neighbors in spite of the restrictions put forth due to Covid. The result of the hard



work and generosity of Parrot Heads around the globe resulting in over 1.3 million dollars for charity and 101,320 volunteer hours. This brings the cumulative total for past 19 vears to over \$58.2 million for charity and 4.5 million volunteer hours!

We continue to exceed the National PHIP Alzheimer's Team goal of \$100,000. Mellissa LeBonge, the Associate Director for the Alzheimer's Association, mentioned that the Parrot Head nation was one of the few groups that met their goal for 2020!

Each of you should be proud of the positive impact you've made in your communities, especially during a time when it was needed more than ever.

Speaking of a positive impact, I'd like to give a big THANK YOU to The Lone Palm Foundation. Knowing that many clubs were experiencing difficult times. The Lone Palm Foundation donated almost \$14,000 assisting 182 clubs to pay their annual dues.

As we start 2021, I encourage everyone to stay safe and don't give up. We can see the light at the end of the tunnel, and it's just a matter of a little more time until we're able to work together and "Party with a Purpose" just like old times!

Jerry Diaz stood on the stage and announced that Pardi Gras, now holding its 24th edition, was the longest running Trop Rock event other than Meeting of the Minds. It's a remarkable achievement for an event put together and still run by Jerry Diaz and his family along with a talented crew made up of dedicated Parrot Heads from all over the country.

For the Diaz family and Pardi Gras, keeping the string alive was no easy task. Last November it was apparent that the event could not be held in New Orleans, and the decision was made to move to Galveston. Instead it had to wait until, as the pandemic continued, the date slid until enough vaccinations had taken place to reopen Galveston for the event in April.

Now a venue was needed. The Strand was a natural since it contained historic buildings, tourists and lots of alcohol, the staples of Bourbon Street. However safety concerns still interfered: there could be no Saturday street parade or a second-line parade, Pardi Gras favorites.

However, most musicians who played the Buffett genre were eager for the chance to perform at a live music event, and the Diazs and their crew were able to assemble a stellar mix of Parrot Head and Trop Rock event headliners and regional Texas talent.

There was still one tradition remaining to fill, a Pardi Gras king and queen, choosing from the list of those who have dedicated years of service to Parrot Head events and their charities. Without the parade and with the unusual circumstances, Pardi Gras chose instead a Grande Dame, someone who had worked to put on this event since the very beginning, Pege Wright.

At the end, the event had raised \$10, 000 - \$12,000 for the regular Pardi Gras charities, and Jerry had the

partygoers clamoring for a return next year, and eager to host our own club events this year. Thank you, Jerry for bringing us all back. This one's for you.

Come Early and Stay Late for MOTM-21! by Bill Connolly and Rob Hill

With the country looking ahead to a summer recovery and a nearly normal autumn, Parrot Head Nation is getting ready to be Back on our Phins Again for Meeting of the Minds 2021, and MOTM Co-Chair Bill Connolly promises to make up for lost time with an

expanded music lineup with some twists. With a blockbuster night of music kicking off the event on Wednesday and a four-hour rocking brunch finale, this vear's program is bursting at the seams.

"I think people are going to want to come early and take Monday off," Bill says, "because there might be no planes on Sunday."

With an official schedule packed with Coral Reefers and first time headliners like Hawaii's star vocalist Anuhea and Southern California's Wheeland Brothers, the MOTM lineup is sure to pack a tropical punch. However, Connolly says he's just as excited about some of the changes around the edges in his first year heading up the event with co-chair Rob Hill. Those changes begin with an open-to-the-public opening night to remember with iconic MOTM veterans Sunny Jim White and Don Middlebrook leading in to Coley McCabe's "Girls Just Wanna Have Rum" All-Star Female Showcase, an event that has played to sold out theaters in the last two years.

"Anyone who's attended MOTM over the years can tell you that there is a lot of great music around town at events that have grown up around the official Meeting of the Minds," Bill observes. "We want to start bringing inside the walls of the Casa Marina some of the best of the things that have been happening outside the walls."

Coley's "Girls Just Wanna Have Rum" Showcase is the first "outside the walls" success to come inside. The program will feature performances by Coley and other Parrot Head favorites including Coral Reefer Nadirah Shakoor, Drop Dead Dangerous, Trop Rock Female Vocalist of the Year Erica Sunshine Lee and rising star Aubrey Wollett.


Website Contest

"There's no question that the Parrot Head world has been especially energized by the emergence of a lot of talented women in the last few years," says Bill, "and this year's event puts them front and center with this opening night showcase."

Another "outside the walls" addition generating some buzz around this year's MOTM program is Kelly McGuire's Lighthouse Songwriter Showcase. For more than a decade, Kelly's five-day showcase at the famed Lighthouse Court drew a listening audience escaping the hustle and bustle of Duval Street. The attentive audience made a slot at the Lighthouse one of the more coveted MOTM-week gigs among songwriters. Kelly and broadcast partner Songwriters Island Radio will bring tasty curated samplings of some of the best songwriters on earth to the Casa for three-hour Bloody Mary brunch programs on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of MOTM week and broadcast it all to the world.

"What we love about the Lighthouse is that it is going to give us a few hours a day to really focus on the music," Bill says. "We have a lot of partying and dancing and rocking and Happy Hours and fun later in the days. "But here's a chance for people to hear the music as it was written, to hear the songwriters tell the stories behind the songs, and to listen to the lyrics while having a coffee or brunch or a Bloody Mary. Sometimes music is a soundtrack for a gathering, and there's nothing wrong with that. But for a few hours every day at Lighthouse, the song is the center of attention."

Wrapping up MOTM week is the "No Plane on Sunday" brunch program from 10-2. Bill recommends planning to stay an extra day, which he predicts will make you far happier than wishing you had stayed an extra day. Who wants to be checking out of a hotel and wearing socks and long pants while Sarasota's Cabana Dogs are belting out harmonies and delivering modern beach music or the Godfather of Trop Rock Jerry Diaz and Hannah's Reef are rocking the Casa to close out five days and more than fifty hours of music?

"Best to plan on there being no planes on Sunday," says Bill, paraphrasing from the 1986 Buffett classic. "Take the day off. If you must work come Monday, work remotely from Key West."

Also required is a current officer list with names, position, email address, home address and phone number.

ALL Chapters must file an Interim Report ... If there is nothing to report, please so state.

Beginning on July 1st, please email your Interim Report and current officer list

to phipmembership@gmail.com with Interim Report in the subject line. An email will be sent to confirm receipt of your report.

I would also like to suggest you CC your Regional Communicators and they can take you off their "reminder/pester" list!!!

If your club hasn't entered or has entered in the past and didn't win, then you should submit a first-time entry or enter again!!!

Did you know:

* Many clubs who submit a blind essay for the contest have submitted an essay before?

* Many clubs don't enter because they think it's based on membership or fundraising numbers.

NOT TRUE!!

Here are a few hints that might help:

1. **BE CREATIVE!!** (if it looks boring & not fun to read and it really has nothing but fundraising figures, it's probably going to get a low score). Make it fun to read! We know you all are creative out there! You show your creativity in your concert attire, tailgating, event decorations and events! Put that same creativity to paper!!

2. Read last year's winning essay, as well as previous winning essays!! They are posted at: http://www.phip.com/club-winners.

Use their creativity as a Guideline!

3. You can't win if you don't enter!! The Golden Coconut Award is like winning the Lottery of PHIP and gives your club membership into a very unique and small group of Clubs who use their win to their advantage! You have bragging rights to use on your website, on your club merchandise! You know you love to talk about your club to anyone who will listen!! Imagine telling a potential sponsor of your event or club that *your* club is a Golden Coconut Winner and then explaining what it stands for!! **We know you can be loud & proud.. put that spirit down on paper!!**

4. Follow the rules!! Yes, we gotta have some stinkin' rules ... (as all contests do, see sidebar to right).

5. Don't have time to write a blind essay to submit?? I would be willing to bet that you have someone in your club who is a creative writer! Tap them as a resource!! There is NO rule that the Golden Coconut must be written by a Club's Officer, the GC just needs to be submitted by the club's contact!! Sometimes a member who would love to contribute in some way just needs to be asked!

6. Every chapter, with the exception of previous Golden Coconut recipients from 2016 to 2020, regardless of size or age, has an equal opportunity to win this most coveted designation!

PHs of Port Aransas Help Get Food to Where Needed Despite Covid Shutdowns

We normally have a late February event called "Spring Phling," which targets our annual Winter Texans. An outdoor party is planned with a live band, food, a Silent and Live Auctions. In the last few years, the designated charity has been the Port Aransas Helping Hands Food Pantry.

This year, we were unable to have the event: there were fewer Winter Texans here, the band that usually played was not available and the Covid-related rule about no large gatherings was still in effect. So we thought outside the box! Here is what we did to raise money:

1. Solicited monetary donations from our members and friends of PHOPA

2. Contributed garage sale items for the City-Wide Garage Sale and 100% of those profits went to our growing fund

3. Had our first Social event in a year and raffled off three large gift baskets

4. Held an Online Silent Auction on our club Facebook page that lasted for four days and reached bidders from across the state of Texas

Last year, the Food Pantry was given a check for \$7.800 and this year, we presented them with a check for \$8,000!!!

To put the importance of this donation into perspective, The Food Pantry helped 1200 households and 1986 individuals in 2020. Even though we are a small town, the need was up significantly because of Covid shutdowns. They can purchase 144 cans of vegetables with only \$20 and also support a Backpack program for local school children that sends home healthy food and snacks. Due to Covid protocol, everything must be individually packaged now, which leads to a greater expense. Every penny of donation is sorely needed.

The St. MinneSomePlace in Paradise Parrothead Club's "Parrotheads on Ice" team participated in the Polar Plunge on March 27 braving the icy waters of Prior Lake to raise \$3,667 for Minnesota Special Olympics.

Cedar Creek Lake Parrot Head held a crawfish boil benefiting

the Cedar Creek Library on February 27th and raised \$1,000.
