Interim Reporting began July 1st and will end July 31st, 2021. After July 31st there are consequences for late submission. The penalty for delinquent filing of the Interim Report shall be a fine of \$100, payable to the Lone Palm Foundation Parrot Head Emergency Phund.

The Interim Report is simply a brief free-form emailed synopsis of your Club's charitable, civic and environmental activities for the period 01/01/21 - 06/30/21. There is no template to follow. It should contain who,



what, when & where and should provide a contact name, if appropriate. ALL Chapters must file an Interim Report ... If there is nothing to report, please so state.

Please attach a list of current board members. Include, position, home address, phone number and email.

Club Website Judging Begins August 15

Parrot Head clubs should not underestimate the importance of having a good website. Your club website is where you tell potential new members your story about Parrot Heads, about your club, about the fun you have helping others in your community. Your club website is also a nexus of information about your club activities that members can use wherever they have internet access. Therefore, you want it to be easy to access and find topics, visually appealing to guests, and as much as possible, creative with our special Parrot Head flair. A good website can make event registration a breeze, keep track of membership and sell club merchandise.

With that in mind PHiP has created a club website contest, now in its second year, to recognize those clubs who are the best at creating and maintaining their websites, and

If Jimmy Buffett Had Become a Texan

Jimmy Buffett's concert tour isn't coming to Texas this year. His concerts in Dallas, San Antonio and the Woodlands, which were postponed last year due to Covid, have not been rescheduled. However, Buffett was in Luckenbach to take part in the Jerry Jeff Walker tribute concert on June 5th. This should surprise no one as Jimmy and Jerry Jeff were close friends going back to a meeting in Nashville in 1970.

Buffett credits
Walker with jump
starting his career by
encouraging him to
move to Florida. Many
big names in the music
business, like Freddie
Neil, David Crosby and
Joni Mitchell, were



coming to Miami at the time. From there it was only a short trip in Walker's 1947 Packard to Key West, and the rest is history. History however, can often turn on a dime. A few months later Walker packed his guitar and moved to Texas. What if Buffett had not gone to Key West but instead had waited and gone with him to Austin?

In fact, Buffett did make a number of trips to Austin to see his friend who used his contacts to arrange gigs for him. Buffett would perform as the opening act at Castle Creek, then a popular Austin nightclub, and he played at Willie Nelson's 4th of July picnic in 1974. However he never quite fit into Walker's lifestyle or the growing Austin based country music scene and would return to Florida to record.

Then after a visit to an Austin Mexican restaurant, Buffett penned the beginning of a verse about a man trying to get over a failed relationship by mixing his favorite cocktail and watching the seasonal influx of tourists on his beloved beach. After hopping a plane back to Florida, Buffett finished the song, recorded it and became rich and famous.

But suppose Jimmy Buffett had never made the fateful trip to Key West in Jerry Jeff Walker's Packard? How might things in the Buffett and Parrot Head world be different?

There would still be a *Margaritaville* (after all that <u>frozen concoction was invented in Dallas</u>) along with the wealth and fame that followed.

After the fame of *Margaritaville*, Buffett would likely have found his place in the Austin "Outlaw Country" music scene. He had already been on stage with many of its luminaries. His band though most likely would not be named the *Coral Reefers*, but more simply, the *Reefers*.

The lyrics to some of Buffett's later songs would likely be different. Every Texan knows it should be *Sliced Brisket in Paradise*, not *Cheeseburger*. Furthermore, sharks aren't a problem here. Instead we have snakes.

Can't you hear them rattling honey? Can't you see them slither around?

Meeting of the Minds would likely be in Luckenbach instead of Key West. It makes sense. Gonzo Mays may have gotten the idea for her mayoralty from <u>Hondo Crouch</u>.

Most significantly, Buffett's fans may never have become known as Parrot Heads. What instead? Perhaps with a nod to Gary P. Nunn, we would all be known as <u>Armadillo Heads</u>.

Now I know my non-Texan readers are aghast at the prospect. Even as a Texan, I would miss the beach lifestyle Buffett personifies. Consequently, we can all be thankful that Jerry Jeff and his Packard were there when needed, and events played out as they did.

London (Ontario) PHC Boasts Two PHiP Scholarship Winners

Every year PHiP awards three college scholarships in the amounts of \$5,000, \$3,000 and \$2,000 to members and their children or wards of chartered Parrot Head clubs. The money, which is awarded in a national competition, is donated by individual Parrot Heads or clubs through a raffle for an all inclusive one-week vacation, this year at Margaritaville Island Reserve Riviera Cancun.

The competition is challenging. This year's entrants submitted for the judges' consideration their GPA, SAT or ACT scores, responses to three short answer questions and a 1500 to 2000-word essay. The entries were judged blindly with no reference to club affiliation allowed.

This year, we have a repeat winner of a scholarship sandwiched by our first ever winners from Canada. Not only are they from Canada but they came from the same club. While we have had a repeat winner before, we have never had two winners from the same club win the scholarship. Congratulations to all our winners.

The winners of the 2021 scholarships are:

Kiersten Forkes from Burlington, Ontario (London Ontario Parrot Head Club) is the winner of the first place award of \$5000.

Heather Erlemann, from Cary, North Carolina (Parrot Heads Of North Carolina) is the winner of the second place award of \$3000.

Again, congratulations to the three winners, and thank you to all that applied as well as our judges who took many hours out of their days to help in making this very tough decision.

It's time to write your Golden Coconut essay.



- * Many clubs who submit a blind essay for the contest have submitted an essay before?
- * Many clubs don't enter because they think it's based on membership or fundraising numbers.

NOT TRUE!!

Here are a few hints that might help:

1. **BE CREATIVE!!** (if it looks boring & not fun to read and it really has nothing but fundraising figures, it's probably going to get a low score). Make it fun to read! We know you all are creative out there! You show your creativity in your concert attire, tailgating, event decorations and events! Put that same creativity to paper!!

2. Read last year's winning essay, as well as previous winning essays!! They are posted at: http://www.phip.com/club-winners.

Use their creativity as a Guideline!

- 3. You can't win if you don't enter!! The Golden Coconut Award is like winning the Lottery of PHIP and gives your club membership into a very unique and small group of Clubs who use their win to their advantage! You have bragging rights to use on your website, on your club merchandise! You know you love to talk about your club to anyone who will listen!! Imagine telling a potential sponsor of your event or club that *your* club is a Golden Coconut Winner and then explaining what it stands for!! We know you can be loud & proud.. put that spirit down on paper!!
- **4. Follow the rules!!** Yes, we gotta have some stinkin' rules ... (as all contests do, see sidebar to right).
- 5. Don't have time to write a blind essay to submit?? I would be willing to bet that you have someone in your club who is a creative writer! Tap them as a resource!! There is NO rule that the Golden Coconut must be written by a Club's Officer, the GC just needs to be submitted by the club's contact!! Sometimes a member who would love to contribute in some way just needs to be asked!
- 6. Every chapter, with the exception of previous Golden Coconut recipients from 2016 to 2020, regardless of size or age, has an equal opportunity to win this most coveted designation!

It was then that many clubs elected to do something as a tribute to Jimmy's father. Our PHiP chapters not only support Alzheimer's to honor Jimmy's father but also because we're seeing this devastating plague insinuate itself into our own ranks.

As many of you know, PHIP is part of a

National Team for Alzheimer's Association. We have said that we would raise \$100,000.00 at this year's walk, and

2021) we have 14,035.00, its only 14% of our goal. We as well as I, have to send emails, Facebook notices or whatever it takes to let others know that we are walking against this disease.

The San Diego Parrot Head Club was pretty much shut down due to COVID, but did raise and donate \$350 to our local Toys for Tots program.

Beaches A1A held their 25th Annual Beach Bash June 17 - 20, 2021 at the Guy Harvey Resort in St. Augustine Beach, FL. Thanks to the generosity of the 300+ attendees, we Partied With a Purpose and raised \$25,000.00 for the Alzheimer's Association.

Padre Island PHC had our Beach Bash 2021 "Blame It On Buffett" and raised money for The Texas Sealife Center by a Raffle and Silent Auction, and on June 25th our club donated \$3500 to The Texas Sealife Center.

Although Music on the Bay was cancelled for 2021, Tampa Bay PHC still raised 11,000 from sponsors, individuals and online donations.

Coastal Jersey PHC Team came in third out of 23 registered at the ACS Relay for Life raising over \$3300.00 to date earning a Bronze status. We are continuing to raise funds for ACS thru July.

The Parrothead Club of Eastern Mass has been very busy despite the situation. We have donated blood a few times at 2 different breweries in the state for Dana Farber, Joe Andruzzi foundation and Hook for a Cure for cancer. We also donated online to NEADS service dogs. They train dogs for people with special needs and veterans! We raised over 800 dollars to help their cause.


