American Breast Cancer Foundation

The American Breast Cancer Foundation (ABCF) operates a national Breast Cancer Assistance Program, providing financial assistance for breast cancer screenings and diagnostic tests to uninsured and under-served individuals.

ABCF makes these lifesaving tests available to individuals who otherwise would have no other means of access. In doing so, ABCF hopes to improve the chances of ruling out breast cancer or diagnosing the disease at an early stage so that it may be treated successfully, increasing survivorship. Over 50 percent of ABCF callers already have symptoms of the disease. ABCF has provided over 50,000 grants for breast cancer screenings and diagnostic services through its Breast Cancer Assistance Program. As a result of ABCF's funding, over 2,000 grant recipients have been diagnosed with breast cancer and were able to take the next step toward breast health. - From Margaritaville's "Think Pink" October 2024 campaign

▶ **JOB TRAINING & SUPPORT FOR MEN TRANSITIONING FROM INCARCERATION**

Turn90

Turn90 is a nonprofit employment social enterprise that leverages business operations to provide comprehensive job training and support for men transitioning from incarceration.

(A social enterprise uses business strategies and principles to meet a social or environmental mission.) The typical Turn90 man was arrested as a youth, which began his cycle of justice involvement: jail – prison – probation – repeat. Making a deep investment in a person’s emotional, social, behavioral, and financial well-being provides the skills to manage life differently, a pathway to legal employment, and an off-ramp from the cycle of incarceration.

Turn90 meets a critical community need by providing employment opportunities and reentry support to men returning from incarceration through mission-driven business activities. It works exclusively with men leaving prison who are likely to return without an intense intervention and wraparound support. Turn90’s social enterprises, including screen-printing and industrial services, offer paid transitional work that empowers participants to rebuild their lives. Revenue from these businesses is reinvested in its holistic program, which includes cognitive-behavioral classes, supportive services, and job placement assistance.

We Thrive

We Thrive is a platform for middle school entrepreneurship that empowers under-resourced youth to thrive in tomorrow's economy.

Each student creates their very own company, earning real revenues and donating profits to a charity of their choice. The majority of students served struggle in school, but 85 %+ of participants finish their first year with long-term assets, having founded their own venture with IP, supply chain, and revenue base, a mentor, and a high-value network to support their success. They also develop future-ready skills: 90 %+ show improvement in indexes of self-efficacy, self-esteem, and grit.

We Thrive's mission is to create a seamless pipeline from childhood to economic leadership.
